7th Annual Translational Research Conference for the Management of NCL's – November 3&4, 2022; Lombard, Chicago



Our Promise to Nicholas Foundation, Dr. Jill Weimer of Sanford Health and a committee of family foundations worked together to host this 7th annual science meeting in Chicago. Invited were elite scientists from around



the world to discusses the latest ideas for translational research for Batten disease (also called NCL). The two-day conference had thirty-eight speakers and over 100 attendees. This year a few folks were able to join this conference virtually as an attendee or speaker. The meeting is designed to incorporate new technologies

and concepts into Batten disease research. This leads to discussions between speakers and the recruitment of new labs and new approaches to researching Batten disease. The history of this conference in that scientists who attend are able to collaborate with each other on how to help solve the puzzle of Batten disease and work toward a cure! One hundred percent of the donations raised for this conference have gone to pay for facilities,



speakers travel expenses, hotel accommodation and food. Together, we raised \$75k which covered the entire expense of this year's conference.

The next NCL Translational Conference will be hosted November 2024 in Chicago.

BDSRA Family Support Conference – July 7-10, 2022; Cleveland, Ohio

We attended the BDSRA family summer conference July 8-10 in Cleveland Ohio and OPTN sponsored the childcare for children affected with batten disease. It was great to be back with these families after not seeing them since 2019. I was joined by Meghan Kelley, Bridget Kelley and Erin Kelley volunteering in the affected kids care room. This year, due to the shortage of nursing care, an organization was hired that provided 12 local special needs teachers to help us in our childcare room. Although these women were not medical professionals, they were kind, caring and compassionate toward our kids. This care at the conference gives the parents and opportunity to attend the conference sessions, learn more about the disease, meet experts, receive support from other families and learn how to best care for their children. Between the two days of care, we had between 28-30 children in



our room. It was challenging at times caring for the more mobile unstable active children, keeping them safe as well as engaging the non-active children. We were grateful to have the additional Batten parents' volunteers to help us this year. I could see lot of



smiles and hear lots of laughter. We made crafts, art keep sakes, played with toys, games, bubbles and gave lots of love and support



to these kiddos! Next BDSRA Family Conference will be July 14- 16, 2023 in Denton, Texas.
